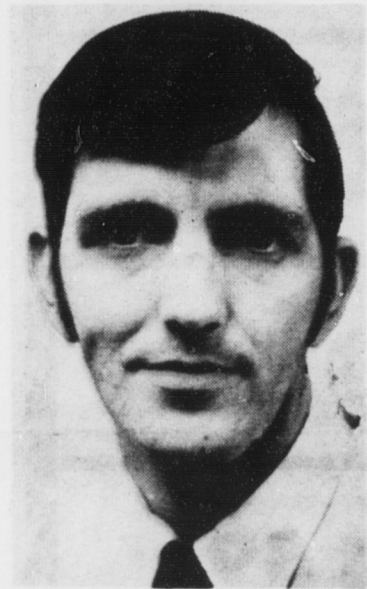

## Six File For Council

Six local citizens filed this week as candidates for the city council and will be voted on in the upcoming election on the possible incorporation of Cooleemee.

Anyone living within the proposed temporary boundaries is eligible to file as a candidate. Five people will be elected to serve as city councilmen if the upcoming election is in favor of incorporation.

The town council will appoint one of the five elected to the board, to serve as mayor of the town.

At this time those filing are Denny Creason, Charles Church, Mrs. Muriel Gude, Flake Blackwood, Ward Setzer and Jackie Morton.

The deadline for candidates to file is Thursday, May 21. The applications may be picked up from Dr. Ramey Kemp of Mocksville, chairman of the County Board of Elections, or from the Cooleemee Journal Office.

The \$5 filing fee and the application must be turned into Dr. Kemp or Mrs. Kemp no later

than May 21.

A new registration for all qualified voters will be held for the purpose of registering the names of the people who want to vote in this special election. Everyone must register in order to vote.

The books will be open for registration at the Cooleemee School on Saturday, May 23, May 30, and June 6. Challenge day will be June 13. The books will be open each of these days from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

The election will be held on June 20.
