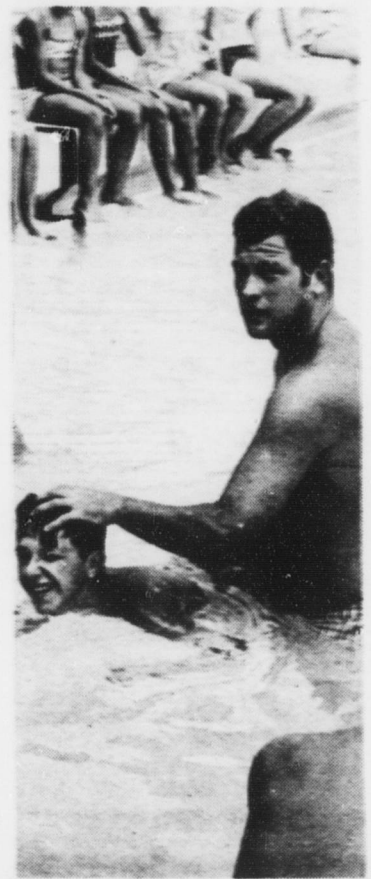
Grimes Parker, Jr. Recreation Director

All interested persons should register on Friday or notify Mrs. Bernhardt of your desired interest, as this will be the only registration day.

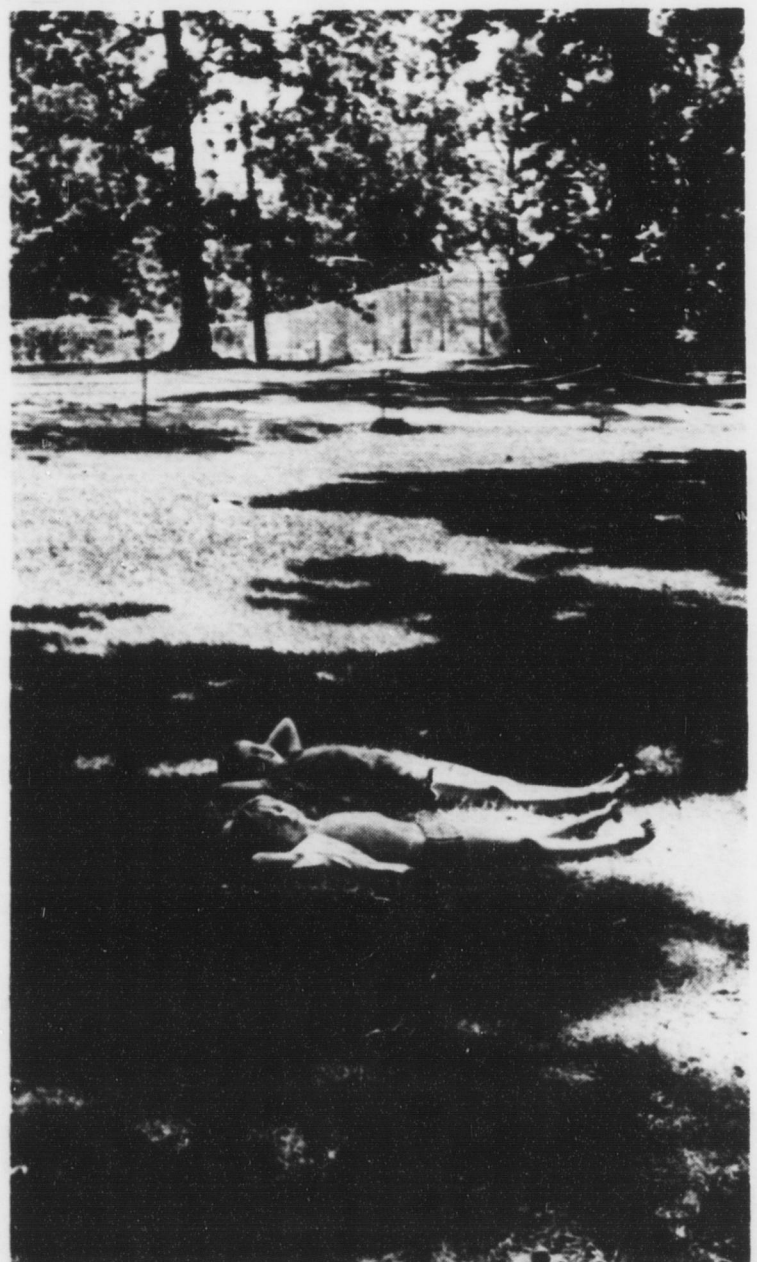
