The Farmville Graded School will open Monday September 18 1916. Patrons are earnestly requested to enter their children promptly and see that they have the necessary books. Owing to the recent floods in the Western part of the State the Text-Book Commission has decided that there will be no changes in the books for the coming session. Therefore if you desire your child to use second-hand books, let them make the necessary arrangements before school opens. Children who will become of age by November first this year may enter at the opening of school and no beginners (that is six year old children) will be permitted to enter after November 1st, according to the ruling of the Board.

Pupils who desire to sell their second hand books will bring them to the school house between the hours of 9 and 13 according to the schedule below:

- Third year high school (last year) Monday Sept. 4th.
- Second year high school Tuesday Sept. 5th.
- First year high school Wednesday Sept. 6th.
- Seventh Grade Thursday Sept. 7th.
- Sixth Grade, Friday Sept. 8th.
- Fifth Grade, Monday Sept. 11.
- Fourth Grade, Tuesday Sept. 12th.
- Third Grade, Wednesday Sept. 13th.
- Second Grade, Thursday Sept. 14th.

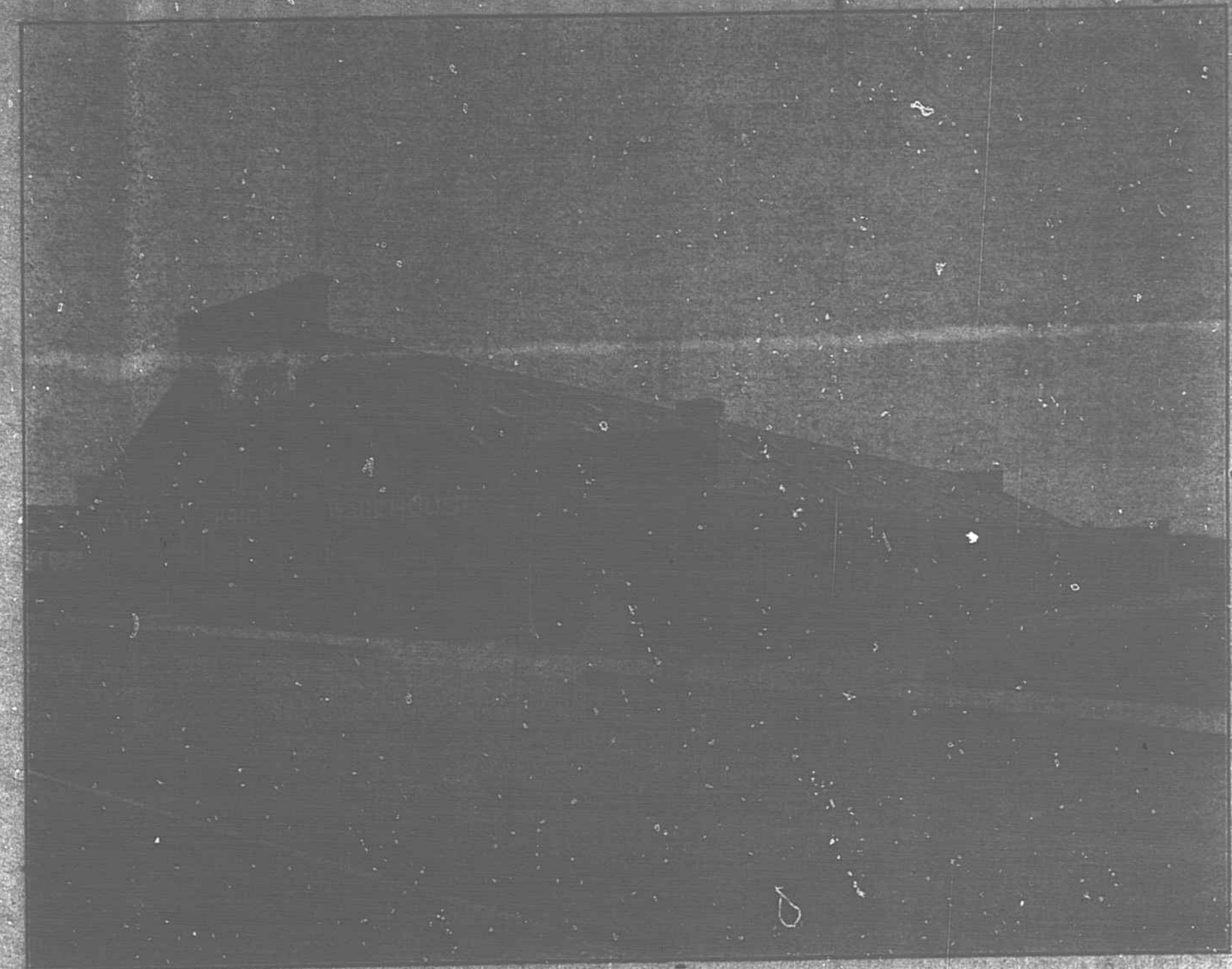
