Rev. H. H. Tuley of Washington, will preach in the Methodist church Sunday night May 11th. All are cordially invited to hear him on a theme vital to the times.

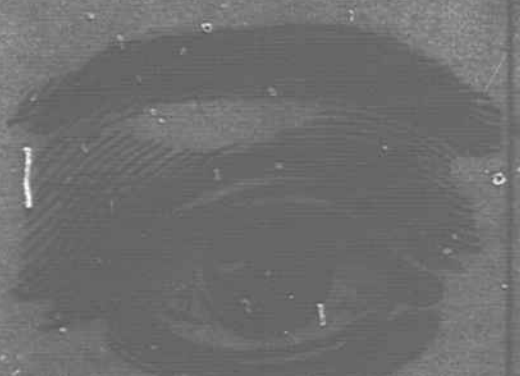
