

Change Date For Opening of Markets.

Wilson, N. C., July 14.—"No scrap" tobacco will be sold on the floors of warehouses operated by the Eastern Carolina Tobacco association this season, it was decided at the annual meeting held here late yesterday.

The opening date of the markets was changed from August 17 to September 1, on account of the present financial situation.

Claims that the sale of scrap tobacco hurt the prices of other grades of tobacco on the floors and also that scrap was more profitable to the farmer as fertilizer, were responsible for the action taken at the meeting.

To The Property Owners of The Town of Farmville Abutting Upon the Paved Streets in Said Town:

If any assessment thereof is not paid within said time, it shall be subject to the same penalties as are now prescribed for unpaid taxes in addition to the interest therein provided for.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Pitt, North Carolina, in the office of the Clerk of said Board, at Greenville, North Carolina, on Monday July 5, 1920, at 2 o'clock P. M. when they will be publicly opened for the purchase of \$100,000 School Bonds of Special School Tax District No. 3, in the Township of Farmville, County of Pitt, North Carolina, of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered from 1 to 100 inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually dated May 1, 1920, and maturing as follows: \$3,000 on May 1st in each of the years of 1921-1930 inclusive, \$4,000 on May 1st in each of the years 1931-1940 inclusive, \$3,000 in each of the years 1941-1950, inclusive. Said bonds will be coupon bonds, with the privilege of conversion into fully registered bonds.

Proposals must be enclosed in a sealed envelope marked on the outside "Proposals for Bonds" and addressed to J. C. Gaskins, Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of Pitt county, North Carolina. Bidders must deposit with said Clerk before making their bids or present with their bids a certified check drawn to the order of the Special School Tax District No. 3, Farmville Township, Pitt County, N. C. Upon an incorporated bank or trust company, or a sum equal to two per centum of the face amount of bonds bid for, to secure the municipality against any loss resulting from the failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid. The purchaser must pay accrued interest from date of the bonds to the date of delivery. The bonds cannot be sold at less than par and accrued interest.

Successful bidders will be furnished with the opinion of Messrs Reed, Dougherty & Hoyt of New York City, that the bonds are valid and binding obligations of said Special District No. 3, of Farmville Township. The bonds will be prepared under the supervision of the United States Mortgage & Trust Company, New York City, which will certify as to the genuineness of the officials and the seal impressed thereon.

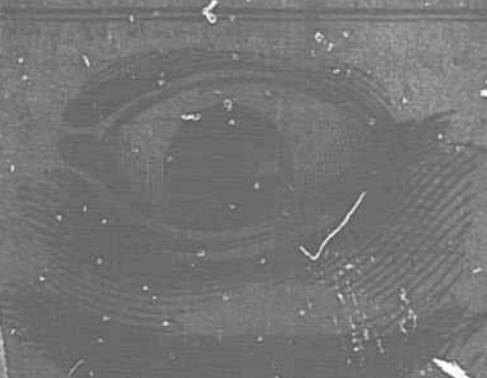
