TO THE VOTERS OF PITT CO.

As a candidate before the Democratic Primary for State Senator, I have been asked concerning my position on several matters. I have, therefore, deemed it proper to make the following statement.  
I favor rigid economy and care in the expenditure of County funds. I am against the issue of any more County bonds for any purpose, unless the issue for a specific purpose is directly voted on by the people of the County. I favor the revaluation of County property and the reduction of tax rate, as county taxes are both burdensome and oppressive. Valuations should be appraised by three freeholders of high standing in each township. I favor the repeal of the Judge's pension act. Such special privileges have no place in a democracy. These pensioners should give way to the worthy and infirm Confederate Soldiers.

Solicitors should be put on a salary. I favor the repeal of the act increasing the Solicitor's salary for Pitt County. I favor increasing pay of Jurors to \$3.00 a day. I favor the paying of witnesses \$3.00 a day and that in case of compromise the plaintiff and defendant shall be taxed for witness fees. I favor the payment of \$1.00 a day to the wife and dependent children, under ten years of age by the State or County of each person convicted and sent to the State's Prison or County roads.  
These are some of the measures I advocate and I will appreciate the support of the Democrats of the County in nominating me for State Senator.
