MOVE MADE TO PREVENT A GREATER JUMP IN BUILDING COST OF NATION

Home Construction May Send Prices Up or Force New Buyer's Strike

Chicago.—Steps to ward off an increase in building material prices and construction costs which might precipitate another "buyers' strike" are expected to be taken at a national conference of construction interests which opened here today for a three-day session.

Delegates to the conference, it was stated today, realize that building activities are increasing, and that there is danger of a corresponding increase in building material prices. The conference, it was announced, will emphasize the necessity of keeping down building costs in order to encourage maximum construction during 1933.

The conference is sponsored by the National Federation of Construction Industries. Several departments of the United States government will cooperate in the work of the conference. The conference will have three sessions.

Kahn, vice-president American Institute of Architects and a leading factor in the Building Congress movement in New York City; Alexander McEwen, president U. S. Mills, president National Association of Builders Exchange; Mr. William Crompton, general manager National Lumber Manufacturers Association; General E. C. Marshall, Jr., general manager of the Associated General Contractors of America; Ralph P. Stoddard, secretary common Brick Manufacturers Association; E. D. Woodward, deputy manager American Bankers Association; Trade Executives Association; L. V. Wallace, president Society of Industrial Engineers; E. J.
