MAKING THE CARELESS MORE CARELESS

Discussing the advisability of the state entering into the automobile casualty insurance business, and making it compulsory for all automobile owners to carry such insurance, the Manufacturers News of Chicago, says:

"There can be no question that the driver whose sense of personal responsibility is imperfect—and there are many such—gains a certain amount of mental immunity and freedom from personal liability," when his car carries public liability insurance.

"Liability insurance being, however, relatively expensive, those who voluntarily buy it usually have some financial sense of proportion and are not likely to abuse its protection. But make it compulsory make every car carry liability insurance as a matter of law, and there will be a decline of personal responsibility, the results of which might be distressing in the extreme.

"It should be obvious that accidents cannot be reduced by permitting the state, instead of the responsible agent, to pay the cost. The assurance that a driver causing an accident would become the defendant in a criminal case would have a much more salutary effect. Such an experience is unpleasant even when acquittal is certain, and even the irresponsible driver would use extreme care to avoid it."

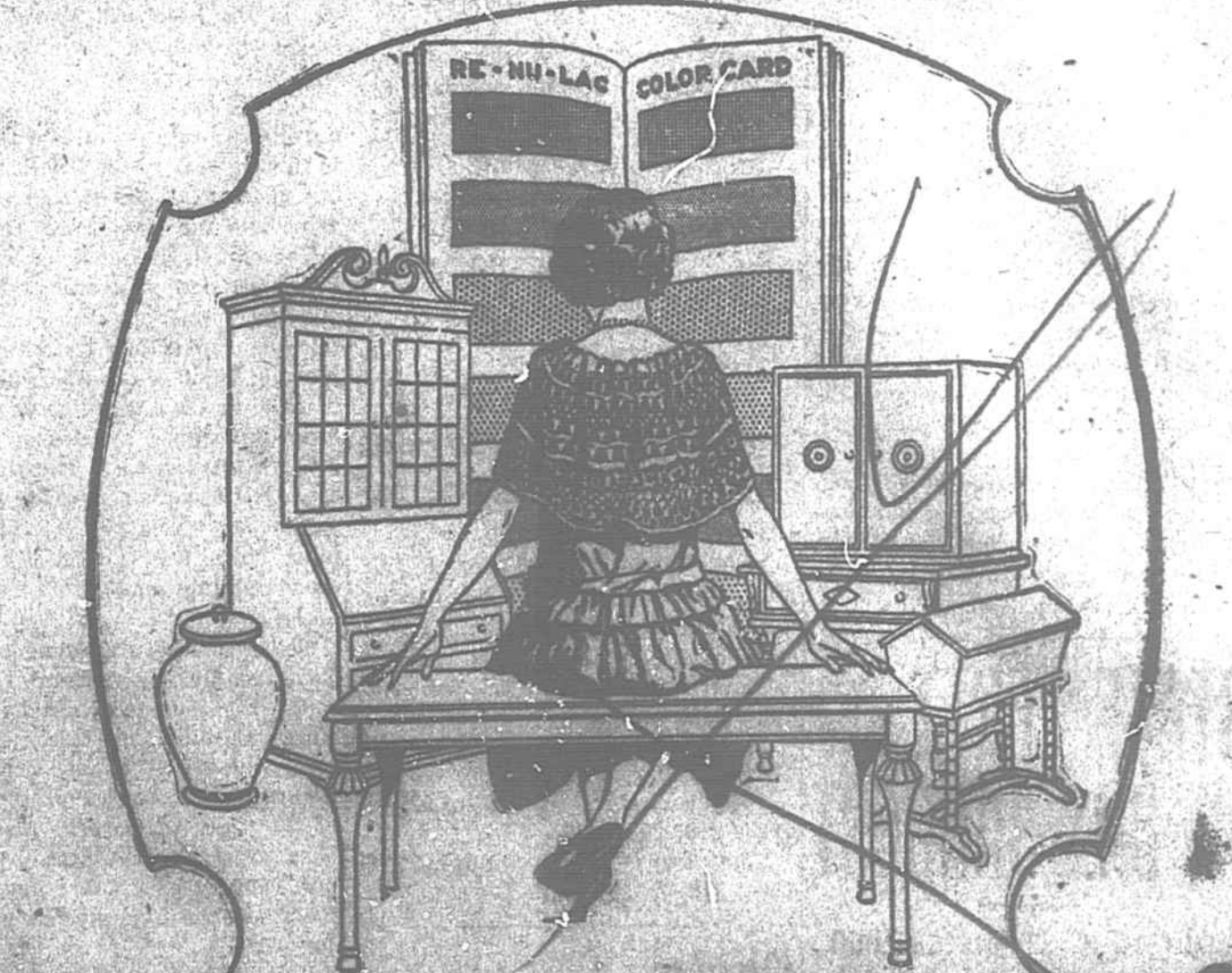
