Honor Not All Gutenuerg'e. Printing is said to have been intim duced to the world Aug. 14, 1487. John Gutenberg stands at the head of the early typographers, supported by the genius of Schoeffer and the generous patronage of Faust. Gutenberg used only blocks, and to Schoeffer is due the movable type cast from matrices, Carton, who introduced the art into England, began life as a trader, but learned printing at Cologne. The first printed book on record is "The Pegiter," which John Faust and Schoolfer

published at Metmin 1487.
