

ed, Dr. Valy Menkin, Harvard Medical School, announced. Leukotaxine, another substance discovered by Dr. Menkin, allows the white blood cells to pass through the blood vessel walls into an injured area. The new chemical, however, is what mobilizes the white cells from the bone marrow into the blood, Dr. Menkin reported.

A triple-gland play may be re-sponsible for changes in the fat content of the liver, Dr. Warren C. Corwin, Squibb Institute for Medical Research, reported studies showing that a line-up of thryroid, adrenal and pituitary glands is probably involved, though scientists previously have believed only the pituitary and adrenal glands controlled fatty changes in the liver.
