Cattle To Be Tested For Bang's Disease

Dr. J. E. Klein of the Bureau of Animal Industry, in cooperation with the Pitt County authorities and the Department of Agriculture, has arrived in the county to test cattle for Bang's disease.

It is required that all cattle, male and female—six months and over, be tested for this disease. Dr. Klein will call on the owners of cattle to arrange for a date at which time the test can be made.

This Bang's disease eradication program is important to the citizens of Pitt County from the standpoint of health as well as from the economic point of view since animals so affected may not reproduce.

Turkey, Iraq Sign Defense Agreement

London.—An agreement between Turkey and Iraq for the joint defense of Iraq and Frenchmandated Syria in collaboration with Great Britain was concluded Wednesday at Anakar, exchange Telegraph (British news agency) reported Wednesday in a dispatch from Istanbul.

The accord was the fruit of consultations between the Iraq ministers of foreign affairs and justice, now in Anakar, and Turkish cabinet members.

Fear Italian Move.
Since France surrendered to the axis powers both Iraq, which maintains close treaty relations with Britain, and Turkey, which had mutual assistance pacts with France and Britain, have shown increasing anxiety lest Syria become a battleground.

The Turks have feared that Italy might attempt to succeed France as the occupying power in Syria and make it a base for further expansion in the Near East.

The United States, it seems, would prefer to send supplies to Europe now than to rush troops abroad later.
