short sketch of the Tree Swallow which is an attractive and useful bird of the air and is in good repute everywhere. The male is steel blue or greenish above, and the female is ller in hue and often plain gray. Both have pure white breasts and throats and are very noticeable when flying.

Holes in dead tree stumps and rot ten upturned roots are its choice nest-ing sites. Like other hole-nesting birds it can be induced to nest in a box. The nest is made of grass and lined with feathers. Four to seven pure white eggs are laid in May. The Tree Swallow breeds in the Northern half of the United States and Northward to Alaska and Labrador, and winters in the South-ern half of the United States.
