Pecan Trees Furnish Fine Nuts and Shade

Here are a few suggestions for setting the trees. Prepare a good place to set the tree, put top soil around the roots, and pack the soil well. Then mulch the tree with straw and don't forget to water it during exceptionally dry weather during the first two years.

Get four foot, balled trees. The best is the first choice for the Coastal Plain and the Piedmont, with the Red and Green River in the Mountains. Other varieties for the Coastal Plain are the Black, Buxton, and the Red and Green River varieties. Get them in the Piedmont.

Get about 2 pounds of 3-5-5 fertilizer when you set the tree, and some more when it is available. Increase the amount of fertilizer each year by 2 pounds.
