STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

QUESTION: How can Johnson grass be eliminated from a pasture?
ANSWER: (Attention Mrs. David M. Smoot, Wake Forest.) Johnson grass can not tolerate continuous grazing or frequent mowings. So the easiest way to eradicate this grass is to fence off the area involved and graze it closely for the entire growing period or mow it each time it reaches a height of about eight inches.

QUESTION: Are baby beef cattle, sold at farm club fat stock shows, included in maximum amounts which slaughterers may pay for all cattle slaughtered during an accounting period?
ANSWER: No. Baby beef cattle sold at such shows and sales are excluded in figuring maximum amounts which slaughterers are allowed to pay for cattle.

Rat Controls To Be Put In Effect

Greenville, April 17.—In Greenville, rats as destroyers of property and carriers of disease are going to be attacked by a clean-up campaign and a rat eradication effort. Last night at the Rotary Club H. A. Hendrix, a member of the Pitt County Health Department staff, told the Rotarians all about the rats and what to do to get rid of rats. He told them about rat dangers and methods of eradication. Greenville plans during the clean-up week to get rid of the rats' food, and a poisoning program to get rid of those here now.

Modern Pig Pens Save Hogs For Meat

Even pigs have gone modern. Granted, the hog does not yet require a bed lamp for reading detective stories but W. J. Ridout, agricultural engineer of the State College Extension Service, said that the use of electricity in the pen will guarantee a higher percentage of porkers for market.

"Electricity for pig brooding is a new thing to most of us," Ridout declared. "Yet, an electric pig brooder can be installed for as little as \$2.59. Records show that from one to two pigs per litter can be saved from freezing and mashing through the use of an electric brooder. If the pig is valued at \$10, the cost of the brooder would be returned four times through its protection of one litter."

"An electric pig brooder is normally built in triangular shape, so that it will fit in one corner of the farrowing pen. It should be strongly built and placed about 18 inches above the pen floor. A hole 10 inches in diameter is made through the center of the triangle into which an ordinary metal light reflector is fitted. The reflector is plugged with a weatherproof socket which will accommodate a 200-watt incandescent bulb of the type commonly used in the home. Wiring can be led from the nearest farm outlet. (If the farm has not yet been wired for electricity, consideration of the pig pen should be included in the wiring plan.)"

"Since the electric load introduced by the brooder will be very small, its use will not cause concern for the efficient operation of other electrical farm implements. Unless the wire must be run a great distance, a No. 12 weather-proof wire is recommended."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a SPECIAL ELECTION will be held in the Town of Farmville, North Carolina, on the 4th day of June, 1946, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said Town, for their approval or disapproval, four bond ordinances, hereinafter described, adopted by the Board of Commissioners on the 27th day of April, 1946, and also the indebtedness proposed to be incurred by the issuance of the bonds authorized by the ordinances. Said bond ordinances are as follows:

(1) An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$42,000 of bonds of the Town of Farmville for the enlargement and extension of the Water Supply System of the Town of Farmville," authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Town of Farmville of the maximum aggregate amount of \$42,000 to finance the enlargement and extension of the water supply system maintained and operated by said Town to supply water to said Town and its inhabitants.

(2) An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$8,000 of bonds of the Town of Farmville for the enlargement and extension of the Sanitary Sewer System of the Town of Farmville," authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Town of Farmville of the maximum aggregate amount of \$8,000 to finance the enlargement and extension of the sanitary sewer system maintained and operated by said Town.

(3) An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$230,000 of bonds of the Town of Farmville to finance street improvements in the Town of Farmville," authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Town of Farmville of the maximum aggregate amount of \$230,000 to finance the improvement of public streets in said Town by grading said streets and by constructing or reconstructing the surface thereof and by constructing or reconstructing, where necessary, sidewalks, curbs, gutters and drains.

(4) An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$186,000 of bonds of the Town of Farmville for the enlargement and improvement of the Electric Light System of the Town of Farmville," authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Town of Farmville of the maximum aggregate amount of \$186,000 to finance the enlargement and improvement of the electric light system maintained and operated by said Town to supply electric light to said Town and its inhabitants.

Each ordinance authorizes the levy and collection of an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds thereby authorized.

The polls for said election will open at the hour of 6:30 o'clock, A. M., and close at the hour of 6:30 o'clock, P. M., Eastern Standard Time. The polling place for said election shall be at the Municipal Building, 119 North Main Street, in the Town of Farmville.

The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Farmville has appointed J. B. Joyner to act as Registrar, and L. P. Thomas and C. A. Tyson to act as Judges of Election for said Election.

NOTICE IS ALSO HEREBY GIVEN that the Registrar will keep the registration book open for the registration of any new electors at 121 North Main Street in said Town on Saturday, May 8, 1946 and on Saturday, May 25, 1946 and on Saturday, June 1, 1946, and that the book will be closed for registration at sundown on Saturday, June 1, 1946.
