### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE NEW ARMY

The following facts were listed by Lt. Frank J. Abbato, commander of the Army Recruiting Station located in Greenville. Lt. Abbato feels that they will be beneficial to many men who are eligible for enlistment or re-enlistment into the Regular Army.

1. Enlistment for 1 1/2, 2, or 3 years.
2. Enlistment age from 17 to 34 years, inclusive, except for men now in the Army, who re-enlist at any age, and for former service men, depending on the length of service.
3. Men re-enlisting retain their present grades, if they re-enlist within 90 days after discharge and before July 1, 1946.
4. The best pay scale, medical and dental care, food, quarters and clothing in the history of the Army.
5. An increase in the enlistment bonus to \$50 for each year of active service since such bonus was last paid, or since last entry into service.
6. Twenty percent extra for overseas service.
7. Up to 30 days' paid furlough, depending on length of service, with furlough travel pay at the rate of 5 cents a mile to home and return, for men now in the Army who enlist.
8. A 30-day furlough every year at full pay.
9. Mustering out pay (based on length and place of service) to all men who are discharged to re-enlist.
10. An increase of 5 percent in pay for every 3 years enlistment—in addition to the many other promotions possible.
11. Option to retire at half pay for the rest of your life, after 20 years' service—or three-quarters pay after 30 years' service. (Retirement income in grade of master or 1st Sergeant up to \$155.25 a month for life.) All previous active federal military service counts toward retirement.
12. Benefits under the GI Bill of Rights.
13. Family allowances for the term of enlistment for dependents of men who enlist or re-enlist before July 1, 1946.
14. Opportunity to learn one or more 200 skills and trades taught in army schools in U. S. or occupied countries.
15. Choice of branch of service or overseas theater in the Air, Ground or Service Forces on three-year enlistments.
16. Privilege of benefits of National Service Life Insurance.
17. Reserve and AUS Commissioned Officers, Warrant Officers and Flight Officers released from active duty may be enlisted in Grade 1 (master or 1st Sergeant). Reserve Officers may retain their reserve commissions.

### Vaccinate Your Dog

There is a State Law which requires that all dogs be vaccinated against rabies and that the vaccinations be done during the months of April, May, and June.

The vaccination program in Pitt County is under the direction of Dr. N. Thomas Edmett, Pitt County Health Officer, who has appointed a rabies inspector for each one of the townships.

Since rabies is largely a hot weather disease, it is important that the dogs be vaccinated early in order to protect them against the disease.

Should we have an outbreak of the disease like they have had in Wake County, it might be necessary for the Health Officer to enforce the quarantine of all dogs.

For the protection of the public, the Health Officer urges all dog owners to have their dogs vaccinated promptly.

### BIRD CLUB

George Parr read an article on the Woodcock at Saturday's Bird Club meeting. This bird is eleven inches long, is brown above, pale orange-brown below; its head is large; neck, short; eyes, large and set far back and high; bill, long with the lower section shorter than the upper into which it fits at the tip.

The wings are short and rounded, the legs short and stout and the toes are without webs. Square patches of black extend from top of crown to snipe separated by narrow gray bars.

The nest is built on the ground on brambly bottoms or in open woods usually not far from water and is not lined, just a depression in the leaves. There are three or four eggs, buffy to grayish white, irregularly and thickly spotted with pale reddish-brown.

The mother Woodcock has a curious and interesting habit of flying off, when disturbed, with a young bird grasped between her feet or thighs, and will convey all her babies, one at a time, in this way if she has an opportunity to a place of security.

The Woodcock's diet includes angleworms, crickets and various species of destructive grasshoppers. To this extent its feeding habits are of distinct benefit to man.
