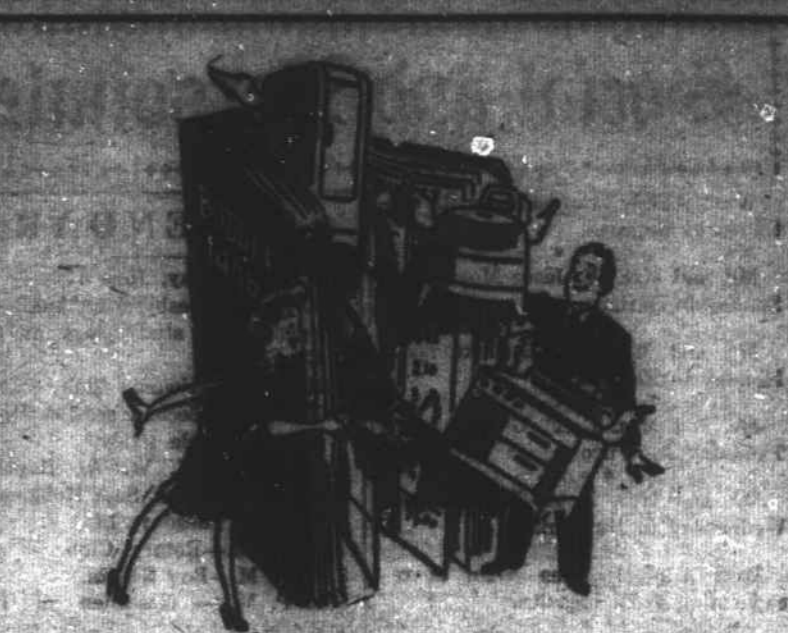

County 4-H Dairy Demonstration Contest Held. Miss Mary E. Thomas, Extension Nutritionist, and Miss Eleanor Mason, secretary to Miss Ruth Current, State Home Demonstration Agent, served as judges at the County Dairy Demonstration Contest held on Saturday afternoon, May 4th at the Agricultural Building in Greenville.

All demonstrations given included information on the food value of milk and the importance of using milk in the daily diet. Attractive ways to serve and use milk and milk products were shown.
