QUESTION: How can I keep my Leghorns from laying tinted eggs? ANSWER: Shell color runs in families, according, to Prof. Roy Dearstyne, head of the Poultry Dement at State College. He sugests that this trouble can be removed by breeding. One Leghorn hen in the college breeding flock has eight out of twelve daughters laying tinted eggs. Other families show no tinter


