Better Quality Feed
Assured This Fall

Raleigh, Oct. 2.—The general quality of feed being sold in North Carolina is showing a steady improvement, according to D. S. Coltrane, Assistant Commissioner of Agriculture, who released figures on recent analysis completed at the State Department of Agriculture.

He said that seventeen samples recently observed and analyzed were guaranteed to contain a total of 340 units of protein, but were found actually to contain 368.5 units. The average protein guarantee of these samples was 20 units per ton, whereas the average found was 21.68 units per ton.

Regarding the fat content of these samples, he declared they were guaranteed to contain 55.50 units of fat and the check-up showed 68.94 units, the average fat guarantee being 3.26 units and the average fat found, 4.04 units per ton.

The 17 samples were guaranteed to contain not more than 162 units of fiber but they actually contained 162 units. The average guarantee was for not more than 9.53 units per ton and the average found was 6.00 units per ton.

"This data indicates that these 17 samples were much better than guaranteed—better by an average of at least two dollars per ton," said Mr. Coltrane.

He asserted, however, that during the months of June and July the quality of feed sold in North Carolina

was, generally speaking, "the poorest we have observed for several years." He attributed the poor quality of feed during the early summer to the fact that all feed ingredients except oats were scarce and that this resulted in too much fiber.

Coltrane expressed the opinion that the trend is toward better feed. He said that "we believe we have passed the worst and that manufacturers will be in a position to furnish a sufficient quantity of quality feeds to meet the demand, and at fairly reasonable prices."

Ammonium dynamite, gelatins, and other such explosives should not be used for ditch blasting operations. Only nitro glycerin dynamite is best for ditching jobs, says Howard Ellis of State College.
