**Contented Chickens Lay The Most Eggs**

You have heard a great deal of talk about "contented cows" but have you ever thought about contented chickens?

Prof. Roy Dearstyne, head of the Poultry Department at State College, says that those pullets are not going to lay all the eggs that they should this winter unless they are given comfortable quarters. And one of the points of comfort is not to overcrowd the layers.

**BIRD CLUB**

Cliff Simpson was welcomed as a new member at the Bird Club, Saturday morning.

The members studied colored pictures of birds after which James Nichols read a story about the Belted Kingfisher, which, at maturity, is one foot in length. His head is large and completely feathered and more or less crested.

The bill is long, strong and very straight. Its wings, which are moderate to rather short in length, point into a tip. Generally there are twelve tail feathers which are one-half to two-thirds as long as the wings.

The upper parts and the belt are bluish-gray; whereas, the under parts are white. The female has a reddish band across its abdomen. The nest, found at the end of a burrow in a bank which the birds have dug, varies in length from 4 to 15 feet. From five to eight eggs are laid on the bare floor of the tunnel.

The Belted Kingfisher is handsome, sturdy and self-reliant and makes his living by the persistent, skilled art of fishing. Its catch consists chiefly of minnows, chubs and related shallow-water fish which are pests to fishermen. It dives for the prey from 15 to 50 feet above the water. With very definite ideas about its fishing rights, the Kingfisher drives away all intruders, if possible.

This interesting legend is told about the bird. Once the Kingfisher was soberly clothed; later one of the species was liberated from Noah's Ark and flew toward the setting Sun. The colors of the sky were reflected against its back and the breast was scorched by the sun rays. Ever since its plumage has shown the beautiful colors of the evening sky.
