L. H. Fountain Speaks To Kiwanians Here

L. H. Fountain, State Senator from Tarboro, brought to the members of the Kiwanis club on Monday evening a thought-provoking and timely message. The speaker discussed in a general way the problems facing the State and the coming session of the legislature, mentioning facts and figures concerning the educational crisis, the health problems, and the condition of a large portion of the rural population.

Impressing the fact that the State will do whatever it can to remedy conditions in all three fields, the speaker stressed that the important thing is not what the legislature might or might not do, but that in the final analysis the welfare of the State as well as that of the nation and the world depends on the brotherly spirit existing between people and the fact that we accept as basis in our lives the principles of the Prince of Peace.

He hammered home again and again the point that faith in God, faith in our fellowman, and the exemplification of the principles of Christianity would do more than any mere legislation to set our state and nation on the right path.

Mr. Fountain was introduced to the club by Sam D. Bundy, program leader for the evening, and in his introduction Mr. Bundy stated that the speaker was an attorney by profession, served in World War II as a Major in the Adjutant General's Department, a past president of the Tarboro Kiwanis Club, and had a perfect attendance record at Sunday School for 22 years.

Guests for the program were Charles Bancroft and Arch Finagan.

After the regular meeting the board of directors and committee chairmen held a training conference in which objectives and duties for 1947 were outlined by Alex Allen, president-elect, Louis Williams, vice-president-elect, and Sam D. Bundy, immediate past Governor.

State College Hints To Farm Homemakers

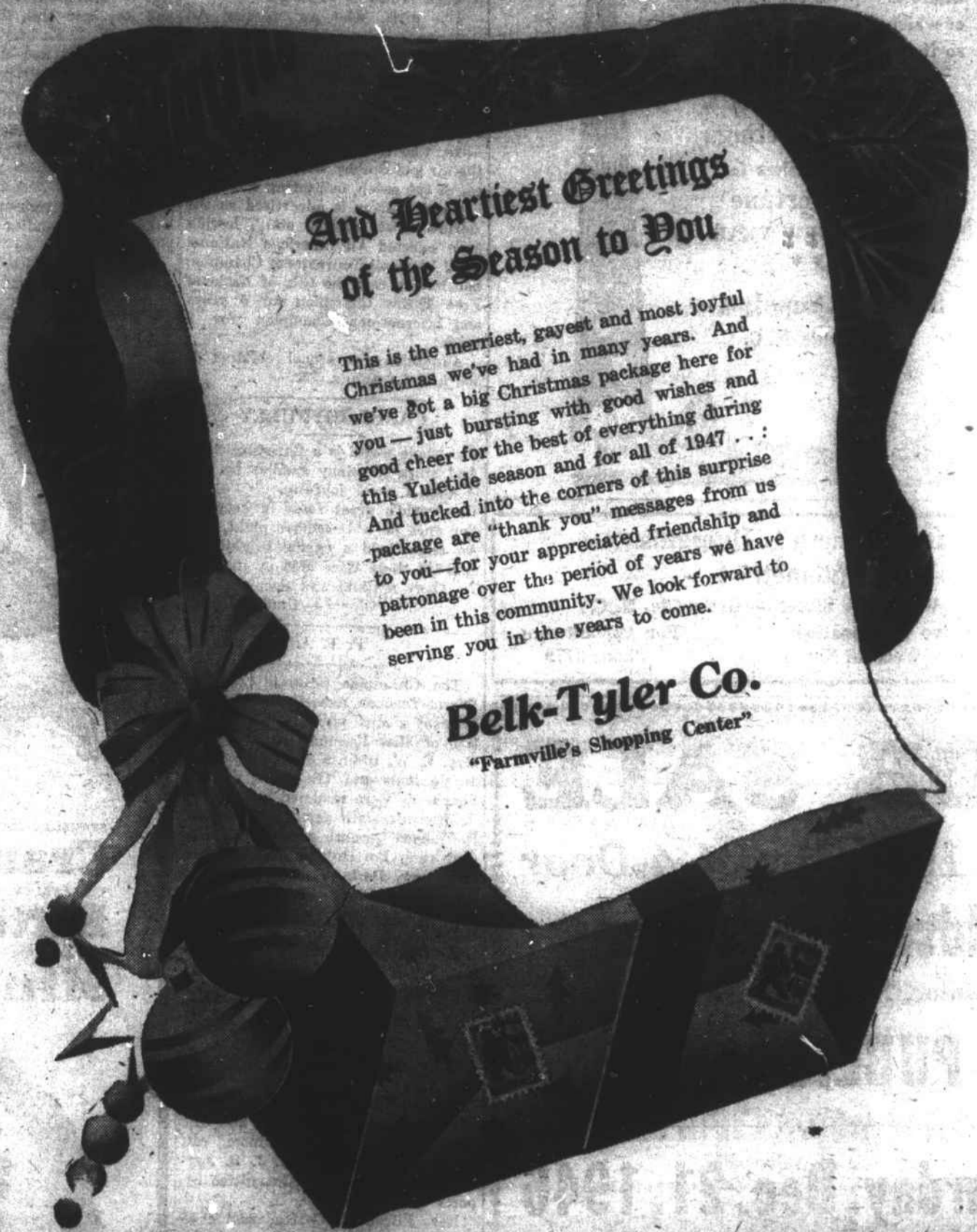
The holiday season may be sweet in many ways this year but not with very much candy. Home made candy is a great favorite both for its taste and for the fun of making it. Sugar is scarce but it will be worth your while to do a little looking for honey, molasses and corn sirup because there are sugar saving sweets to be made with these.

Dried fruits and nuts can be dressed up to take the place of candy. Dates, figs, prunes stuffed with nut meats and lightly rolled in sugar are something special. The Bureau of Human Nutrition and Home Economics gives this recipe which is popular with adults and children:

Fruit Balls: Wash and dry 1 cup prunes and 1 1/2 cups raisins. (If prunes are extra dry, soften slightly in water.) Grind through meat chopper, using medium knife. Add 1/2 cup chopped nut meats if desired. Mix well with 1 tablespoon lemon juice and few grains of salt. Make into balls, 1 rounded tablespoon mixture to a ball, and roll in sugar. Store in a tin box or tight jar. If available, other dried fruits—figs, apricots, or dates—may be substituted for part or all of the prunes or raisins.

Amidst all the activities of the holiday season, the homemaker needs to be prepared for those after-Christmas meals when unexpected guests stop by to bring greetings. Leftovers may be tucked away in a white sauce without anyone being the wiser that they are leftovers. They may be kept simple or made more elaborate by adding such foods as chicken or almond. A fresh sprig of parsley or a bit of pimiento may be added as a garnish. Tumpeting casseroles, steaming soups, attractive salads, or unusual desserts satisfy the taste whims of all.
