All-American Red Heads To Play Boys' Team Here, Dec. 31

The All-American Red Heads, the world's champion girls' basketball club, will play the Farmville High School Boys on Tuesday, December 31, at 8 o'clock in the gym.

This will be the biggest basketball event ever staged in Farmville and a huge crowd is expected.

The girls, who are former All-Americans, play only men's teams using men's rules and have played before nearly 2,000,000 people in seven seasons in all sections of the country.

The tallest team member is Gene Love, who towers 6 feet 4 inches in the air and Stubby Winter is the lowest of the seven, measuring 5 feet 2.

Hazel Walker is advertised as the world's most famous star, having been selected All American National AAU Women's Tournament Champion and having won the title of National Free-Throw Champion for 6 years and International Champion for 2 years.

Admission for school children is 50c and for adults, 75c.
