Profitable Yields Of Soybeans Easy

Profitable yields of soybeans can be obtained easily, say the agronomists with the N. C. Agricultural Experiment Station, as the result of a series of tests conducted throughout the soybean producing section of the Coastal Plain.

Three important steps must be followed if the grower is to realize these profitable yields, the research workers found. They are: Lime and soil with dolomitic limestone in accordance with the requirements as shown by soil tests, fertilize with adequate amounts of phosphorus and potash, and plant and secure a good stand of an adapted variety.

The varieties recommended by the Experiment Station are Ogden and Roanoke. The Roanoke has a higher oil content than any other soybean adapted to North Carolina. The average oil content of this variety on a moisture-free basis is approximately 21.5%, while the oil content of the Ogden is 20.1%, and that of the other more commonly grown varieties is approximately 19.0%.

With the Ogden variety an average of all the tests showed the following yields: No lime or fertilizer, 22.0 bushels; lime alone, 24.3 bushels; fertilizer alone, 27.3 bushels; lime and fertilizer, 34.4 bushels. The Roanoke variety showed a similar response.

The rate of fertilizer used was 400 pounds per acre of 0-10-20 applied at planting time in this experiment.

From these results, it is clear, the research workers say, that lime alone or the phosphorus and potash alone will not give the maximum yields of the crop. A combination of the two, lime and fertilizer, is required for the highest yields of soybeans.

State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

QUESTION: How can higher yields of soybeans be secured?

ANSWER: The Agronomy staff of the N. C. Agricultural Experiment Station suggest that you keep in mind these three important steps in soybean production: Lime the soil with dolomitic limestone in accordance with the requirements as shown by soil tests; fertilize with adequate amounts of phosphorus and potash; and plant a good stand of an adapted variety.

QUESTION: Is it safe to eat canned food that has frozen?

ANSWER: Freezing alone won't hurt canned foods, according to food specialists of the State College Extension Service, who say it is the after effects of the freezing that may cause trouble. By this, they mean if the freezing of the food causes it to swell and break the jar or the air-tight seal, then you can look for trouble, as bacteria will be allowed to enter. If you find leakage in a jar, use the food immediately. Upon opening, if you detect even the slightest signs of spoilage, destroy the food immediately.

QUESTION: What can I do to kill mites on strawberries?

ANSWER: B. B. Fulton, entomologist for the N. C. Experiment Station, says that Dinitic Dusts have been found effective in the control of mites, and though some burning damage may be received through the use of this material, he feels that its use is justified when a heavy outbreak occurs.

State College Hints To Farm Homemakers

To make an orange easier for lunch-bus-toting youngsters to eat, this is what Westinghouse home economists suggest: Score from stem end to blossom end in about eight sections, cutting through skin only. Pull back rind about half an inch, then wrap the whole orange in waxed paper.

To speed up the defrosting of your refrigerator, empty the ice trays and fill with hot water. Put the trays back in the evaporator, turn the control knob to "off" and close the refrigerator door. In about 15 minutes the ice will melt off and the unit is ready to be reset for freezing.

Chocolate and cocoa stains should be removed as soon as possible, and always before laundering. For white cottons and linens, dip the fabric in and down in hot water, wash in hot soda, bleach any remaining stain with hydrogen peroxide, and rinse well. For any washable colored fabric, wash in lukewarm soda, and use carbon tetrachloride to remove any grease spots caused by cream.

A new broom sweeps clean, and so does a clean broom. To keep a broom clean and in top condition, douse it in medium warm soda, rinse well, and hang it up by the handle to dry thoroughly. Add a few drops of ammonia to the soda when washing a very dirty broom. When not in use, hang the broom so that the straw does not rest directly on the floor.

To preserve the garbage pail, treat it to a thorough washing with soap-suds once a week followed by a hot water rinse and thorough sunning.

Use kitchen scissors to save time. Cut parsley, celery, pimento, and string beans with them. Use wet scissors for dicing sticky foods such as chicken, dates and marshmallows.
