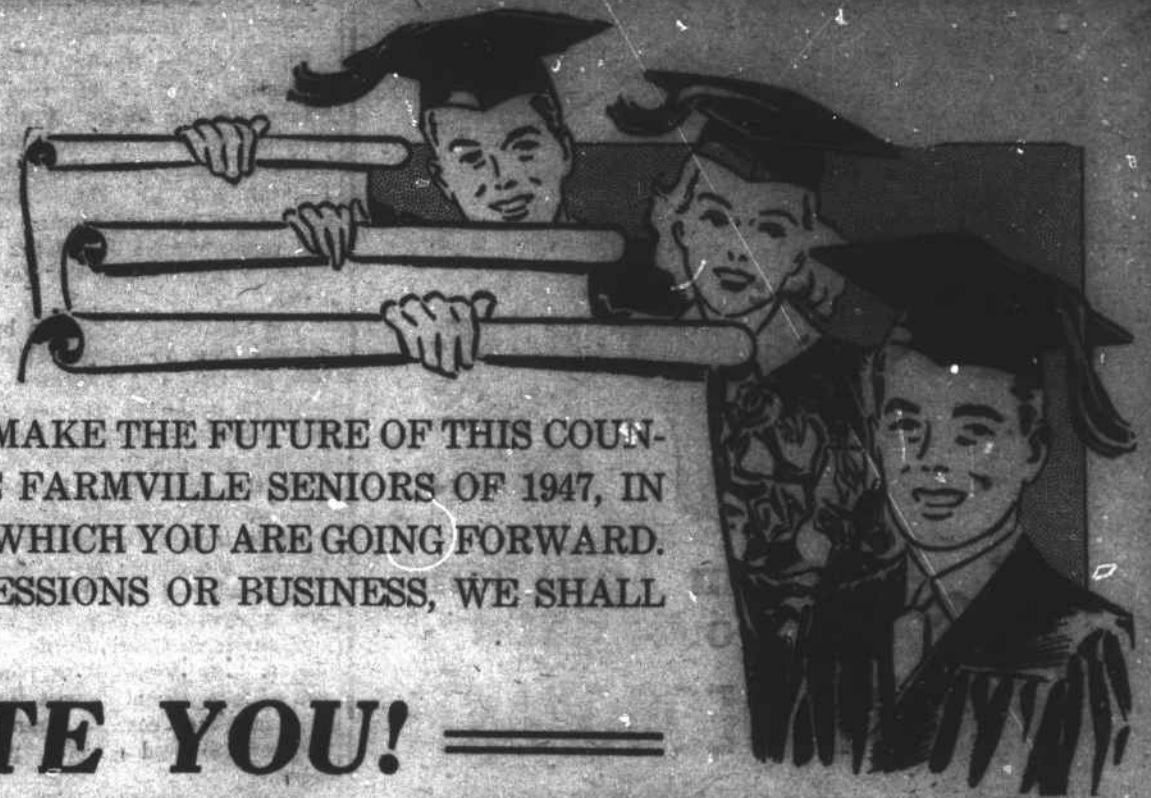

32 Seniors To Receive Diplomas Monday Night

Dr. H. S. Hilley, President Of Atlantic Christian College, Will Deliver Address At Graduation Exercises.

With the presentation of diplomas to 32 members of the senior class, Farmville high school Monday night will officially ring down the curtain on its 1946-47 session and will close another chapter in the lives of those young men and women to whom this page is dedicated.

The program, which begins at 8 o'clock, will be featured by the commencement address of Dr. H. S. Hilley, president of Atlantic Christian College, Wilson.

Monday night's program will open with the invocation by Rev. E. R. Clegg, pastor of Farmville Methodist Church. The high school glee club will render four selections: "Mah Little Banjo," Dichmont; "A Winter Lullaby," Dekoven; "The Sleigh," Kountz; "The Donkey Serenade," Friml-Stothart.

Dr. Hilley, an outstanding man in his profession, will be introduced by Arch J. Flanagan, a member of the school board. Following the address and the presentation of diplomas, Superintendent J. H. Moore will present the special awards.

Baccalaureate Sermon
The baccalaureate sermon will be preached Sunday night by Rev. James M. McChesney, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, Goldsboro.

"Come Thou Almighty King" has been selected as the opening hymn, following which Rev. Clegg will deliver the invocation. "The Heavens Are Calling," by Beethoven, will be presented as a special number by the glee club. After the reading of the scripture and a prayer by Rev. E. W. Holmes, pastor of the Farmville Baptist Church, and another special number by the glee club, Rev. E. S. Coates, pastor of the Farmville Presbyterian Church, will introduce Rev. McChesney. "Onward Christian Soldiers" will be the closing hymn, and Rev. Z. B. T. Cox, pastor of Farmville Christian Church, will offer the benediction.

Officials of the school consider themselves very fortunate in securing the services of two such able speakers for the commencement program and it is anticipated that the auditorium will be filled for both of the exercises.

Serving with Lewis and Flanagan on the school board are J. Irvin Morgan, Jr., secretary, A. C. Monk, Jr., and Dr. John M. Newborn.

The Fountain board is composed of E. A. Fountain, chairman, Earl Trevalton, L. P. Yelverton, Roderic Harris and Alton Moore. Mrs. Harman Baker is principal of the Fountain school, whose students, on reaching high school, are transferred to Farmville school.
