

European Need For Food Is Critical

Millions of Europeans have abso ntely no hope of escaping starvation in the coming months unless they re-ceive immediate help from the Unit ed States, according to Paul Comly French, Executive Director of Cooperative for American Remittance to Europe, Inc. (CARE).

In a special food survey release at a press conference Thursday, Mr. French declared that conditions in many countries, instead of improving with spring crops, have worsened.

"After suffering the severest winter in over a hundred years, homeless, hungry Europe suffered its most disastrous spring," Mr. French stressed. "Floods and frost destroyed basic crops and grain reserves in country after country. Even present

In his nation-by-nation analysis of the food situation in Europe, Mr. French said the situation in Romania was perhaps the worst. There, he reported, people are eating grass and bark and perishing from hunger. It is predisted there will be continued A Big Shipment of DAVIS TIRES ine in that country next year, he

Mr. French told reporters that CARE is equipped to handle a total of 50,000 packages a day. The organization now is sending about

12,000 a day.

The need for food is so great in Europe that the Government should do a major part of the relief job, Mr. French declared. He added, however, Governments move through slow, tangled channels and, while they debate, people starve. Therefore, individual voluntary relief



es must step in and provide the immediate help, the CARE direc-

Great Britain today, Mr. French reported, is on an official ration four per cent lower than its strict war-

Briefly, his survey disclosed that: In Holland, conditions are worsening because of the severe winter which closed all the canals.

Austria's food production is at than half its prewar level and the country's division into four zones has seriously hampered distribution of available food.

In Poland, average consumption has dropped from 2,060 calories in February to 1,880 calories in March. Food is the most desperate problem in Greece, much of the population being forced to struggle along on an estimated 1,200 calories a day. Spaghetti has disappeared from Italy; January rations provided 750 calories a person a day.
