Roy T. Cox, former register of deeds of Pitt county, died in Pitt General hospital at 1:30 Friday morning after suffering a heart attack a few hours earlier. Funeral services were conducted at the Winterville Baptist Church at 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon by the pastor, the Rev. E. G. Cole, and burial was in the Winterville cemetery.

Mr. Cox, son of Mrs. Susan Jackson Cox and the late A. G. Cox, was born in Winterville, April 16, 1890, and spent all his life in Winterville. He attended the Winterville school and Wake Forest College. He was associated with the A. G. Cox Mfg. Co., and was also engaged in farming. In 1912, he was married to Jane Kittrell of Ayden. He was a past member of the Pitt county Board of Education and the Pitt county Board of Commissioners. He was also vice president of the Winterville Bank. He was register of deeds for Pitt county from August, 1940, until his resignation in September, 1946. He was a member of the Winterville Baptist Church and had served on the board of deacons. Surviving are his wife; two daughters, Mrs. J. D. McGibbon, Jr., of Greenville, and Mrs. R. P.
