**BIRD CLUB NOTES**  
 The Pine Siskin was the bird studied at the Bird club Saturday morning with Chandler Cox as the reader. Four and three-fourths inches long, its upper parts are grayish or brownish, under parts, white; the tail is short and forked, legs are short; the wings are long and pointed.

Usually located in a conifer from 20 to 30 feet up, the nest, which is well concealed, has walls roughly constructed of hemlock or other twigs and moss. The saucer-shaped structure is about one-half foot across and the interior, measuring about two inches in diameter, is carefully and thickly lined with plant down, fur and hair.

Pale bluish or greenish-white lightly spotted with chestnut and some black, the eggs number four to six.

The Pine Siskin is found from the Atlantic to the Pacific. Its notes are somewhat similar to the Goldfinch and are rambling and lively. The song, which lasts an hour or more at a time, is very agreeable.

These birds congregate in large flocks and look like plain little striped brown sparrows. When in flight the yellow patches are noticeable on the wings and tail.

Feeding principally on the seeds of the white cedar, tamarack and various pines and spruces, this bird also eagerly seeks bare ground where he can eat the fallen seeds of maples, elms, grasses, weeds and pumpkins.
