Judson H. Blount of Greenville, president of the North Carolina Merchants Association, announces the day. appointment of John Council Parker of Farmville to the important transportation committee of the organization, which now has a membership of more than 6,000 merchants.

In releasing the announcement Dowell, executive vice president and secretary of the Association, reported that special standing committees have been appointed to: (1) investigate and recommend new services which the organization might render its members; (2) investigate motor and rail freight rates being charged in North Carolina and to report to the Board of Directors any discriminations which might be found; (3) al years ago. recommend to the Board of Directors policies for the Association to pursue on various legislative, governmental and public affairs matters; (4) have jurisdiction over the finances of the Association, and (5) arbitrate differences and complaints which might arise between local associations or direct members of the Association.

The committee of which Mr. Parker is a member will function during the 1947-48 convention year.




