This was a very helpful and interesting study. We had as our guests Mesdames P. R. Fines, Elbert Tyson and Rosa Eagles.

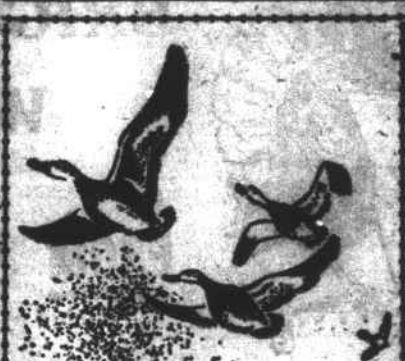
At the close of the meeting iced drinks and cookies were served.
