

OCEAN KING HOTEL TO BE SOLD AT AUCTION DEC. 4

Ocean King hotel, newest hostelry at Atlantic Beach, the Idle Hour Amusement Center, Surf Club, Boardwalk concession stands, bath houses and utilities will be sold at auction at Morehead City on December 6, according to an announcement made this week by A. B. Cooper.

Cooper, controlling owner of Atlantic Beach, Incorporated, stated his property is being sold due to the fact that it has grown so much during the past two years that he cannot take care of all of them. In addition to the hotel, amusement center,

club, and other buildings to be sold, many business sites and over 400 vacant home building sites will be included in the sale, one of the largest of its kind conducted along the Atlantic coast in recent years.

Atlantic Beach on which the properties to be sold are located, is an incorporated town with a mayor, police department and utilities. The resort was first established in 1928, but during the two decades of its existence, it has become one of the foremost ocean playgrounds in North Carolina and along the mid-Atlantic.

Bud Dixon, Farmville native, served as manager of the Ocean King.

HOOKESTON MAN PRODUCES 115 BUSHELS CORN PER ACRE

E. E. Butts, Hookeston, produced on a shelled weight basis, 135.1 bushels of corn per acre on 8.8 acres using N. C. hybrid 26. This field of corn was planted on April 15 in 40 inch rows, 10 inches in the drill. At planting time, 300 pounds of 4-10-6 fertilizer was applied under the corn; at 12 inches high, 600 pounds of a 7-7-7 was used and at 2½ feet when the corn was laid by, 300 pounds of nitro of soda were applied. These fertilizations are on a per acre basis. This corn was produced at a cost of approximately 25

per bushel for fertilizer and seed. Mr. Butts sold this corn for \$2.25 per bushel, which left him \$300.00 per acre for land, labor and equipment.

In 1948 some of the land which heretofore has been planted in tobacco could be used profitably on a corn program similar to that of the Greene county farmer. The corn could be sold or, better yet, used for feeding hogs.
