MONTHLY PAYMENTS BEING MADE IN ROCKY MOUNT AREA Monthly benefits totalling \$33,495 were paid to 2558 residents of the 16 counties of Beaufort, Bertie, Dare, Edgecombe, Greene, Halifax, Hertford, Hyde, Lenoir, Martin, Nash, Northampton, Pitt, Tyrrell, Washington and Wilson, in Federal old age and survivors insurance payments in the month of June, Mr. Barney, manager of the Social Security Administration field office at Rocky Mount has announced.

With the United States well into the reconversion period, the Social Security Administration has not experienced as great an upswing in the number of claims filed as some people had predicted for the period when the high employment of war years began to drop off. Mr. Barney pointed out, however, that there are many people who would be drawing old-age and survivors insurance payments if they realized that they were eligible. His belief is borne out by the fact that a substantial number of people who do file a claim find that they have lost at least one month's check by not filing promptly.

For the nation as a whole in the month of June, the Treasury department paid out \$35,071,472 in monthly benefits under this program. Mr. Barney explained that this total was the amount actually paid in June. Many others have filed claims and would be receiving monthly payments if they were not earning more than \$14.99 a month at jobs in commerce and industry.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,000 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF FOUNTAIN TO FINANCE STREET IMPROVEMENTS IN THE TOWN OF FOUNTAIN, N. C. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Board of Commissioners of the Town of Fountain, N. C., as follows: Section 1: The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Fountain, N. C., has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town improve public streets in said Town by constructing curbs, gutters and drains on certain of its streets, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purpose not less than \$4,000.00.

Section 2: Said Board of Commissioners has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said Town within the meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of North Carolina, and is a purpose for which said Town may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said Town. Section 3: In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of Fountain, N. C., are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate amount of bonds authorized by this Ordinance shall be \$4,000.00. Section 4: A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 5: A statement of the debt of said Town has been filed with the Town Clerk and Treasurer of said Town, as required by said Act, and is open to public inspection. Section 6: This ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of said Town at an election to be called and held as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 12th day of November, 1947, and was first published on the 21st day of November, 1947. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication. E. C. NEWTON, Clerk of the Town of Fountain, N. C.

BIRD CLUB George Farr read an article on Brewer's blackbird Saturday morning at the Bird club. The male is black and the female brownish-slate. The head and neck are strongly glossed with violet and the rest of the plumage with bluish green; the bill is black and eyes are pale yellow. The nest is usually built low but sometimes 30 feet up in trees or bushes, and is made of a rough foundation of twigs, plant bark, and root-lets mixed and held together with mud, and lined with finer similar materials. Handsome of all the blackbird race is Brewer's blackbird, with its glossy black coat shimmering in the sunlight with reflections of purple, blue and green. It does not hide its beauty in some woodland solitude, but comes near yard and often builds its home near the farmhouses, nesting in colonies, the usual number of families being five to ten. The male shows its mate a great

deal of personal courtesy, during the building of the home, but it seems to think it would be beneath his dignity to lend a hand in its construction to aid her labors. Considered a very valuable bird in California, the Brewer's blackbird of ten has completely cleaned a threatened invasion of spring cankerworms to the pine trees. They work from tree to tree destroying them as they go. They follow the course of a plow and eat the grub worms as they appear on the newly opened ground. As to the fruit, no more is eaten than may be considered a fair return for the destruction of insects. Buy - Bank - Sell in Farmville
