

Hudson Dealer Pleased With Car's Reception

During the 31 years he has served as Hudson dealer, B. O. Taylor of Farmville states the new model now on display in his show room has received more compliments than any of its predecessors. He estimates that at least 2500 inspected the car in the first few days it was on display.

He has received word from the factory that production of new Hudsons is increasing steadily in volume; with the new models now rolling off the assembly lines at a rate averaging 2000 cars per week.

Manufacture of the new cars started October 12 and since then the rate of production has increased at an accelerated pace.

Two-line production is now under way. The second assembly line was started after production was built up initially on the first line.

The manufacture of six-cylinder cars, powered by the entirely-new

121 horsepower Super-Six engine, has begun, and their production is being rapidly built up.

The company swings into production on brougham models this week, he stated, and will follow in about three weeks with production of the club coupe. Initial production has involved four-door sedan models.

Employment totals have also increased since the new car went into production.

WESTERN AUTO ANNOUNCES FISHING CONTEST WINNERS

Prize-winners in the annual nationwide Western Auto Big Bass Fishing Contest have just been announced by the Western Auto Supply Company. The contest was conducted in the 35-state territory in which Western Auto Stores, and Western Auto Associate Stores are located.

Awards are being made to five winning fishermen in each state, C. Hubert Joyner, manager of the local Western Auto Associate Store says.

Winners in North Carolina were announced as follows: First prize, Barney Carpenter, Cherryville; second, Jasper T. Naylor, Dunn; third, R. S. Lloyd, Carrboro; fourth, Tom Hudson, Rockingham; and fifth, Jessie Jacobs, Pembroke. First prize is a six-horse-power Western Auto Wizard Outboard Motor. Other awards consist of fishing tackle. Total value of prizes for the 35-state competition was placed at \$10,387. The bass for which Mr. Carpenter

was awarded first prize, weighed 11 pounds, 15 ounces and was caught in Lake Hickory. Largest bass reported for any state was 14 pounds, 4 ounces, caught in the state of Florida.

The annual contest is sponsored to stimulate public interest in the sport of fishing. The competition started May 15 and closed September 30. It is restricted to fresh water large-mouth and small-mouth black bass caught in waters that are open to the general public for fishing.

A total of 40,000 contestants registered in this year's Big Bass Contest. Western Auto officials have already announced their intention of conducting the contest again next year.

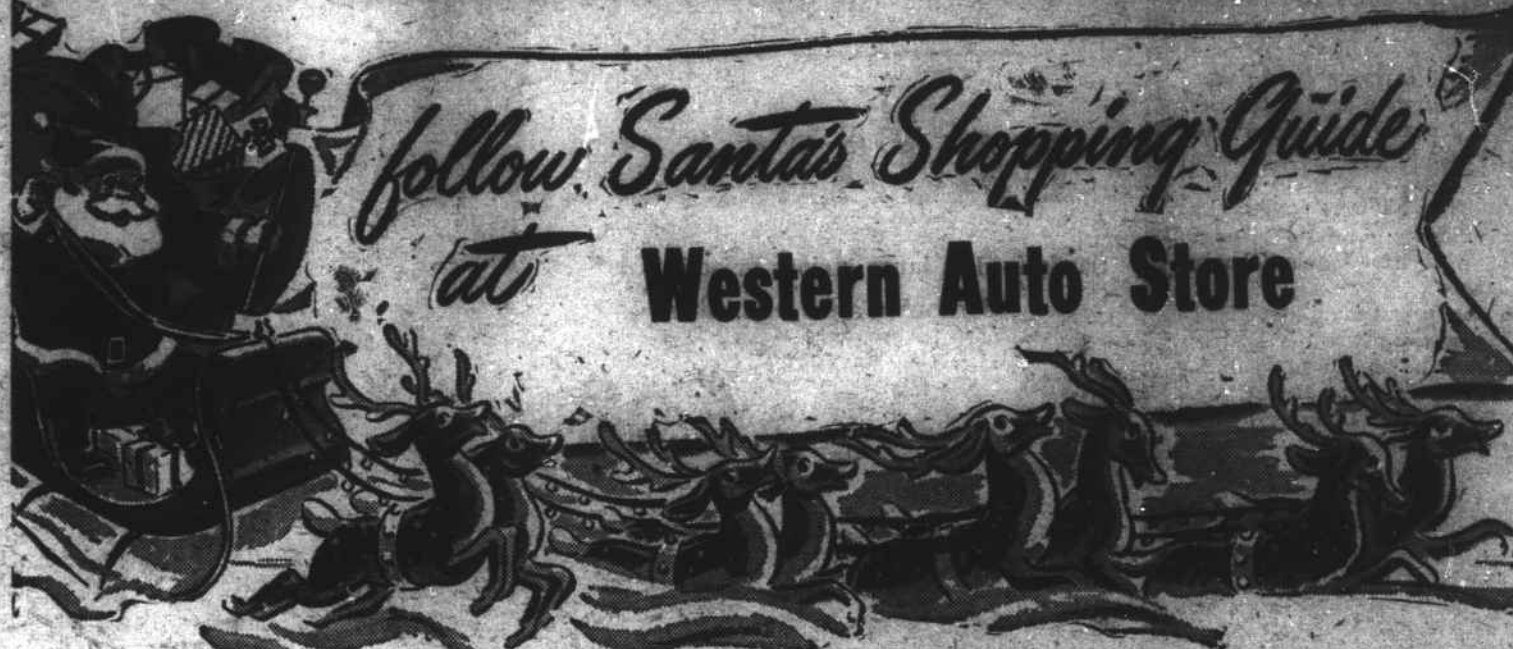
