Davidson, N. C., Sept. 9.—Davidson College will have first year teams in all of the major branches of athletics during the coming school year, which starts this week. A full time coach has been secured to give his attention to freshmen and in this way the Davidson athletic council hopes to give better training to material for future Wildcat varsities.

Couch Dawson, formerly at Wake Forest at the University of Georgia, is now directing the early training of the freshmen football candidates at Davidson.

Five games are on the 1923-24 football schedule. Of the five grid-iron battles, only one is booked for home, that the opening game of the season with Furman University freshmen here October 6. The full schedule is announced today follows:


Oct. 6.—Furman freshmen at Davidson.
