### CAILLAUX, CAT OF FRANCE HAS REGAINED HIS FEET

PARIS, April 24.—The Cat has returned to French politics.

Joseph Caillaux, central figure of many a French drama, with nine physical and nine political lives, has

been called upon by his country to lead it out of a maze of internal strife.

He has stood up in duels, been shot at and survived. He has been mobbed and beaten into insensibility by semi-political opponents and survived.

Eight times he has been crushed in politics. Now is calmly preparing to lead his ninth political life, as minister of finance.

Caillaux's life has been the most wonderful, romantic and most sensational in modern history.

Born in 1863 at Le Mans, he was trained for the law, but he bankered for politics and soon got into the game.

His father had been conservative minister of finance under the premiership of the Duc de Broglie, but the younger man joined the radical socialists of which he was afterwards the leader.

Inherited Finance Knowledge  
He inherited from his father a knowledge of financial problems and in time was acknowledged to be the best authority on the subject in the republic.

At 25 he was made governmental inspector of finances. Ten years later he was selected deputy in the Chamber of Deputies for the Department of Sarthe and held this seat until 1919. He was minister of finance in four cabinets and was prime minister two years.

In 1914, fatal year for the world, Caillaux became the object of ver-

bal thunderbolts hurled at him by Figaro, a powerful Paris paper, edited by Gaston Calmette.

Every day editorials were published dealing with some phase of Caillaux's career. His personal, political and business life was sought for flaws.

Paris rang with the gossip that Calmette had in his hands a document so gravely compromising that even he hesitated to use it.

On March 16, 1914, Caillaux was in the Senate debating his bill pro-

viding a tax on incomes, a measure responsible for the majority of his enemies.

Wife Shoots Editor  
On the same afternoon Madame Caillaux, simply dressed in black, entered the offices of the Figaro to see Calmette. Without a moment's hesitation she drew a revolver and shot the editor to death.

She was locked in prison on a murder charge. Caillaux resigned his

post. His career seemed ended.

War was closing in on France, but scant attention was paid to world politics. The whole topic of assassination was the Caillaux drama.

She was Caillaux's second wife. When she married Caillaux in 1911, Poincaré, afterward French president, had acted as her witness at the civil ceremony.

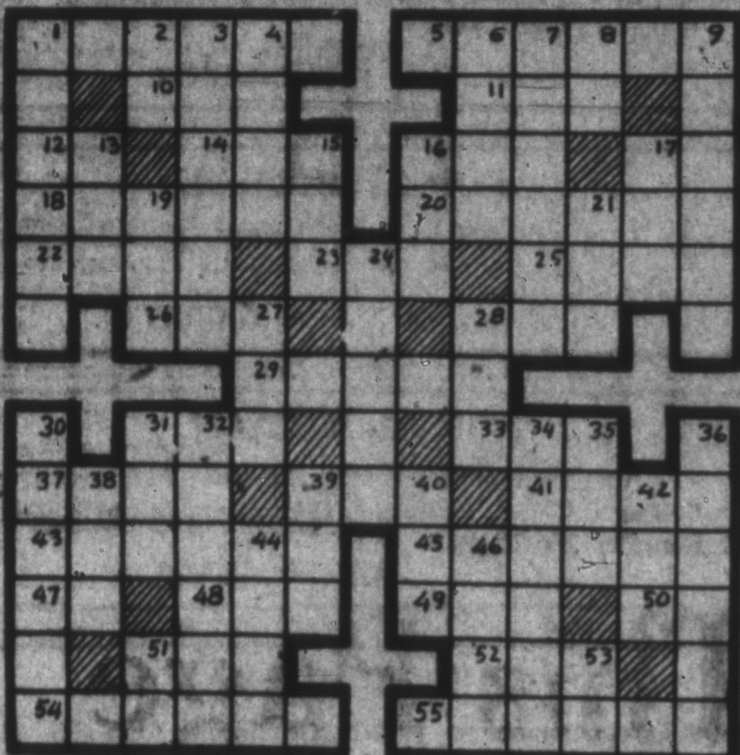

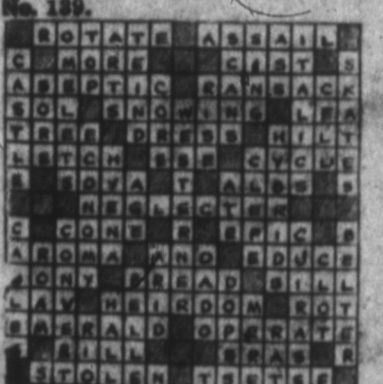

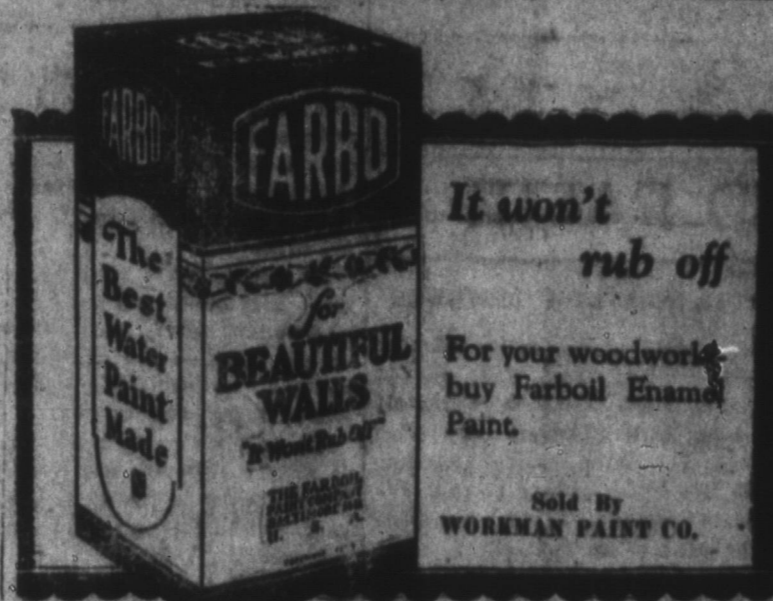
