The opportunity for every person in America to possess one of the coins bearing the image of Lee and Jackson is at hand. This is not primarily a Southern movement. Men and women in all sections of the country are interested and will participate, but the Southern people have a peculiar interest in the coin when it is commemorated and in the completion of the monument memorial. It, therefore, behooves the people of the South to take the lead in the matter. The day will come when these fifty-cent Lee and Jackson coins will be preserved and handed down from generation to generation as a memorial to the great men of the South.
