ago, passed twenty years of his life, recently was unearathed in middle Egypt by the Egyptian Exploration society, Thomas Whitemore, American representative, said upon his arrival on the Mauretania.

The palace was in an unusual state of preservation and will add much to the knowledge of the king, whose tomb was excavated at Luxor, he said.
