

WOMAN RETURNS FROM W. C. T. U. MEET

Miss L. M. Omer One of Two Delegates From This State; Fine Convention

Miss L. M. Omer returned Monday from attending the fifty-first convention of the National Woman's Christian Temperance Union held in Detroit, Mich.

Miss Omer, of Charlotte, and Mrs. Omer were the only delegates present from North Carolina.

The Detroit "The World's Motor" women gathered from all parts of the world, distinguished by the "The World's Motor Capital" and set an example to other manufacturers, for in his extensive automobile works alcoholic drinks cannot be used by employees.

Miss Anna A. Gordon, the beloved president of the National Woman's Christian Temperance Union, presided with her usual charming and most business manner. The year 1925 is given to the host of young peo-

ple who have responded to the appeal to sign the temperance pledge and call for law enforcement.

Miss Gordon said in her address: "The child is sitting where the Master placed him—in our midst. The ages are in his keeping; his training is in ours." The electric tomorrow demands from the rising generation—the generation that will navigate the air—clear brains and steady nerves. We must formulate for the leaders of tomorrow a program that will equip youth with a knowledge of the moral, economic and patriotic reasons for total abstinence and prohibition. The "p-p", prayer, and power of youth are ours for the seeking. Let us give to the rising generation broad views of life and destiny. Let us set before them high ideals of character and give them a clear vision of the heights to which they may climb, and the noble deeds they may achieve already many are impressed with a deep and weighty sense of responsibility for the use they may make of life and its gifts and opportunities. Let us win them for "the fight for a clear brain."

The prohibitory law, local, district, provincial, state or national,

once secured, must at all costs be maintained. How can this stability be better assured than by giving the best and giving to public and private schools systematic, scientific temperance instruction? This foundation work is just as necessary today as it was when the W. C. T. U. was first organized. It will require at least a generation to stabilize in any country a national prohibition law. A conference of the President of the United States and state governors, October 20, 1923, recommended as a part of a law enforcement program, education of school children as to the evils of alcoholic beverages.

Use every "bright shining lever of God" to lift the children of all nations in to the light of a clear and steady brain, a pure heart, and an untroubled hand.
