Cavolina Only South Atlantic Seaboard State Not Having Plant

RALEIGH, June 16-49-in spite of North Carolina's rank of second in the state in the consumption of Portland cement, this state and S. Carolina are the only ones along the south Atlantic seaboard that do not have plants for the production of this material. Statistics from the tinited States Bureau of Mines, jus! received by the division of mineral resources of this department, show that North Carolina is one of the ten leading states in the consumption of Portland cement.

During the months of March and April of this year 682,174 barrels of
