

SOLDIERS WILL STAGE BOXING CARNIVAL HERE

Boxing Talent of Motor Mechanics Will Have Chance to Display Their Skill.

A boxing carnival, in which the boxing talent in the Third and Fourth motor mechanic regiments will have

an opportunity to show the stuff they've got, is going to be staged in the city Auditorium Wednesday, May 22. A wrestling match is also expected to be a feature of the evening.

The main bout will be eight rounds between Johnny Gardner and Billy McCoy. Gardner has met Ted "Kid" Lewis, Milburn Saylor and Joe Mandot; it was stated, and McCoy claims the championship of New England states at his weight, 142 pounds.

The semi-final will be between "Young Phillips," who held the navy's championship in the 118 pound

class for three years, and Ed. Picard, who held "Kid" Williams to two 20-round draws.

Lee Crevier and Billy Ryding, at 128 pounds, also are scheduled for a bout, this being six rounds. Another six round go scheduled will be between Pierson and Webber, who weigh about 138 pounds.

The final event will be a wrestling bout in which "Cyclone" Moore, who challenges anyone his weight (142 pounds) and who has thrown most of the wrestlers at the camp, will be matched against "Young" Gotch of

Chicago. Moore claims the Ohio state championship.

Lieut. John R. Kearns, who is known throughout the regular army as "Soldier" Jack Kearns and one of the army's greatest boxers, will act as referee. In camp, Lieutenant Kearns is called "the private's friend."

Major Stone, who has been appointed athletic officer of the Fourth motor mechanics, under whose general direction the boxing carnival will be staged, is a man and officer who has taken a great interest in various branches of athletics.

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
