FUEL OIL-Number 4 coupon came valid January 30 and will be good for 9 gallons until April 6. Period 3 coupons good for 9 gallons and valid through Febmary 19.

GASOLINE-Coupon No. 4 in A book good for three gallons Temporary "T" coupons will be ssued directly by ration boards for a period of not more than 30 day . Boards will use original ODT contificates only for check-

TIRES-Holders of Ration A coupons must have tires in spected by OPA on or before March 31. Holders of B and C must get tirst inspection by Februnry 28

SHOES-Coupon 17, in the ugar and coffee ration book entitles each holder to one pair of shoes until June 15, when a new stamp will be designatel.


