

Farmer's Income Tax Due Dec. 15

Making farm income tax returns for 1943 is one of the important jobs to face North Carolina growers next month, says Dr. I. O. Schaub, director of the State College Extension Service.

He points out that the farmer is required to file a declaration with the U. S. Collector of Internal Revenue as to his 1943 income and pay the estimated tax on this income on or before December 15.

To assist farmers in making out these returns, the Extension Service has issued a special publication, War Series Bulletin No. 27, entitled "Making Farm Returns". Growers can get copies at the county agent's office or by writing the Agricultural Editor, State College, Raleigh.

Application blanks for filing the declaration may also be obtained at the office of the county agent.

Deputy Collectors will visit each county before December 15 and these men will assist farmers in completing their declarations. Announcement

The Collector of Internal Revenue has pointed out that if there is a change in income or expenses between December 15 and 31, such changes will be reflected in the final report which the farmer must make on March 15.

Where a farmer made tax payments on March 15 and June 15, these payments will apply on the 1943 taxes under the "pay as you go plan" and the balance of the taxes are payable with the declaration of December 15.

Canadian Cadet Pleads Guilty

procedure. His chief counsel, Edward V. Broderick, entered the plea and an associate counsel sought and received 10 days in which to file motions.

Broderick told reporters later that no arrangements had been made to have a psychiatric examination of the defendant. Assistant District Attorney Jacob Grumet said outside the courtroom that he hoped to bring Lonergan to trial "some time in January."

The tall, slender Canadian serviceman was taken into custody in Toronto soon after his wife's body had been found, strangled and beaten, in her Beekman Hill triplex apartment. The district attorney's office said Lonergan confessed the crime.

First Soldier's Medal Given In North Ireland

Belfast, Northern Ireland, Nov. 22.—The first soldier's medal awarded to a United States soldier in northern Ireland was presented today to Private Ray F. Beasley, Shorts Creek, Va., by Brig. Gen. Leroy P. Collins, commander of this area.

Beasley won the medal for saving an aged Belfast man from drowning in August, 1942. Although not a swimmer, the soldier leaped into a river fully clad, pulled the man to safety, saw that he was taken to a hospital, and then walked 20 miles back to his camp in his soaking uniform.
