### Egg Production Up, Other States Down

North Carolina was the only state in the entire United States to show any sizeable increase in the production of eggs in the first five months of 1945, according to the U. S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics.

In fact, egg production in the United States was down 7 per cent for this period, while production in North Carolina was up 2 per cent, or 10,000,000 eggs, as compared with 1944.

Poultry specialists of the State College Extension Service point to

the steady progress of the poultry industry in North Carolina along all lines. Better breeding and feeding methods, coupled with good work by the poultry hatcheries in the state, have resulted in more eggs per bird and a much larger increase in total production, the specialists say.

North Carolina poultrymen are much more careful than formerly of getting disease-free chicks, of providing better housing and more sanitary conditions for growing out the chicks, and of producing strong, healthy pullets, capable of laying large numbers of eggs. Much, however, remains to be done along this line, according to the specialists, and North Carolina can continue to show improvement from year to year.

One of the most important factors in large egg production is good breeding. This subject is being carefully studied at State College and all agencies are cooperating to building up the flocks in the state that produce hatching eggs.

More R. O. P. flocks, superior cockerels, better feeding and housing, more disease-free chicks, and practical sanitation measures, these are some of the chief points in building still greater egg production in North Carolina to meet the competition that will come after the war, the Extension specialists explain.

### STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS Farm Questions

QUESTION: How can I control downy mildew on watermelons?

ANSWER: Applications of any good dust containing 6 per cent metallic copper, except mixtures containing sulphur, will give control, if made before the disease appears, says Howard R. Garriss, Extension plant

pathologist at State College. This disease also attacks cucumbers, cantaloupes, squash, and other members of the cucurbit family. Garriss suggests the first application of dust when the runners are about 8 to 10 inches long, with other dustings at periods of 5 to 10 days, depending on weather conditions.

QUESTION: How can cattle lice be controlled?

ANSWER: A rotenone-sulphur dip has been giving good results, says J. Myron Maxwell, Extension entomologist at State College. Where small numbers of animals are involved, dust applications of the rotenone-sulphur mixture are used. In some sections of Western Carolina the use of the dust has become so general that shortages have been reported.
