Warning Against Crotalaria Given

Raleigh, April 10: A warning against the use of crotalaria as a cover crop on areas to be grazed by livestock comes from Dr. William Moore, head of the Veterinary division of the State Department of Agriculture.

He said that it has been found that the plant contains a powerful alkaloid poison, effects of which do not show up immediately on farm animals. Rather, he explained, it accumulates in the system over weeks and months, finally killing them.

"The insidious thing about this is that the owners, not knowing the effects of the poison plant, may blame other causes for the losses. Crotalaria is a good cover crop - - when livestock are not involved," said Dr. Moore.

Cotton Situation

Because of the economic condition of cotton, and competition from other fibers, the South faces low incomes and inadequate living standards. Too many people are depending on the farms of the South for a living. Too many farms have worn-out soil and makes low crop yields. They need to put cotton into balanced program with other crops and livestock. Complete mechanization of the farm will mean fewer people required to operate it and be dependent upon it; thus having a higher per capita income. There is great need for more small industries in our section to help carry the economic load.

Pan American Day

April 14 has been designated as a day for observing Pan American Day. The slogan is "Free and United - The Americas Go Forward." This day will be observed throughout 21 American Republics. Farmers are, perhaps, the closest allied groups in the Americas. Farming is the principal industry in the American Republics.

Once again the folks who feed the nation are busy planting another large crop of food, feed, and fiber. They are starting out with about the same number or fewer workers.

The progress made in recent years in Agriculture is almost unbelievable. Corn yields have increased immensely. Cotton and tobacco fields have gone up by about a third. Hens are now laying almost twice as many eggs in a year as they used to. Ten litters of hogs can be produced in 6 months, and cows generally give more milk than they did several years ago.

Back in the days of George Washington, one farm family was able to produce enough of food for itself and one other family. Today one family can produce enough for itself and 19 other families. Such progress as this has made America great, and is why we were able to win the recent war.
