"The Recreation Commission would like to thank all who helped, supported, and walked," Slaughter said.

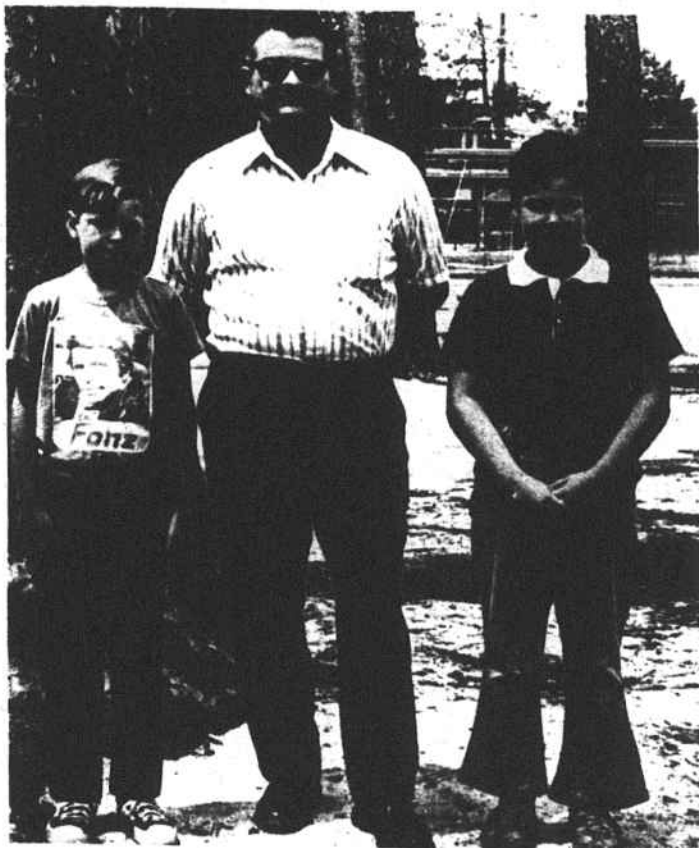
