Injury Accident, Break-ins Reported

Two boys were injured Saturday on East Donaldson Avenue behind J.W. McLaughlin School when the bicycle they were riding was struck by a car, Raeford Police Chief Leonard Wiggins reported.

He said the driver was not charged.

Corey Thomas, 9, of 918 N. Jackson St., Raeford, was admitted to Cape Fear Valley Hospital in Fayetteville for treatment of a fracture of a leg, and his passenger, Damaris McLean, 923 N. Jackson, was treated at the same hospital for minor injuries, then released soon afterward, Wiggins said.

He said the car was being driven east on Donaldson by Jeffrey Blake Register of 327 Old Farm Rd. when the accident happened soon after the bicycle entered Donaldson from Stewart Street to travel east.
