In a survey of the seven schools, it was found that 235 adults and 23 students have volunteered since school began in September.

The 23 students are seniors at Hoke High School who belong to an organization known as HOSTS.

These young people have volunteered to tutor fellow students who have trouble with certain subjects they take each day. HOSTS members devote as many

as 4 hours per week to this program.

Volunteers have also been a great help in the Cultural Arts Program. These people have aided in fund raising drives, they have accompanied students on trips, and have assisted in preparing for concerts and programs.

In vocational education classes, volunteers have come from industries such as Burlington and Faberge. There have also been many individuals who have shared the knowledge they have in a particular area, with students.
