Jordan: Small Counties Will Get Attention

Giving Hoke County and other smaller areas of the state "a voice" in North Carolina government is one of the top priorities "in my husband's campaign," Raeford native Sarah Jordan said during a recent visit to her "home town."

Last week, Jordan saw "a major accomplishment" that she helped instigate become a reality as North Carolina Governor James B. Hunt placed a memorial to the state's war dead in the Memorial Amphitheatre at Washington's Arlington National Cemetery.

"Bob sponsored the senate bill and it passed," Jordan said.

"I just could not believe we had never had a memorial for war dead," she added.

'When I went to Arlington and saw we were not represented, I knew something had to be done," Jordan said.


Jordan admits that she is "very proud" of "that particular ac-complishment."


