Gatlin receives **Scholars Grant**

Susanna Gatlin, a senior at Christ Church Episcopal School in Greenville, South Carolina has been awarded a Younger Scholars Grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

The \$1,800 grant will be used to study Charleston, South Carolina, theatre in the 18th century.

Gatlin is one of only two high school students in the United States to be selected for this honor.

Sixty-seven college students also received Younger Scholars Grants in 1984, the program's first year of operation.
