


Headed for home This Buck player rounds the bases and heads for home plate during Friday's game against Lumberton. The Bucks lost the game by one

Road Runners win in SC Windchaser

Five members of the IEA RoadRunners won awards Satur-day in the Windchaser Road Races held in Spartanburg.


