

Democratic convention draws county faithful

Approximately 100 party members attended the Hoke County Democratic Convention held Saturday in the Hoke County Courthouse.

State Senator David Parnell who was the principal speaker, stressed the importance of voting and supporting the Democratic Party.

Parnell was introduced by Sam Morris, past Chairman of the Party.

County Chairman Harold L. Gillis will lead a delegation of 12 to the Eighth Congressional District meeting in Southern Pines on June 2 at 1:00 p.m. The State Convention will be held in Raleigh on June 9.

Candidates or their representatives were introduced to the convention.

Teal leaving Heritage

Franklin Teal has resigned as the Raeford manager and vice president of Heritage Federal Savings and Loan Association.

straight, but after this appears in print, maybe he will appear at the office.

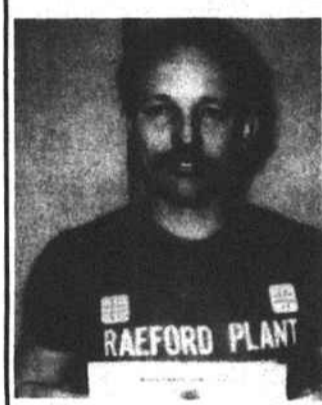
