Sandhills extension offering new courses for Hoke students

The Division of Continuing Education at Sandhills Community College will begin several new courses in Hoke County next week. All of these classes are non-credit.

Inza Abernathy will be teaching a class in Notary Public Education at the Hoke County Public Library on Tuesday and Thursday night, May 22 and 24. The class will meet from 7-9 p.m. Participants should be 18 or older and possess a high school diploma or its equivalent.

Students must also be registered voters in the State of North Carolina. The cost of this class is \$10.

Almeta Smith will be offering two courses at the Wayside Community Building on Wednesdays beginning May 23 and continuing through June 27. From 9-12 noon Mrs. Smith will teach Sewing and from 1-4 she will offer Quilting. The registration fee is \$15 for each of these classes.

A course that will be offered for the first time in Hoke County is Sharon Shaw's "Survival Skills in Written Communication."

The course is intended for those

planning to go to college from high school, for older individuals interested in going to college but who are frightened of writing, and for those who simply want to improve their communication skills.

The course is aimed toward individualized or small group instruction.

Students will be allowed to practice whatever type of writing will help them the most, whether it be essays, letters, or sentences and paragraphs.

This class will meet from 9-5 on Monday - Wednesday and from 9-2 on Thursday, May 21-24. The registration fee is \$10, and the class will be held at the Hoke County Public Library.

As with all classes offered at Sandhills, there is no registration fee for North Carolina residents age 65 or older. Students may register at the first class meeting.
